## Your Contributions Continue the Success of our Programs

#### **LEARN**

- 40% of former Foster Care Youths are incarcerated (Wake County Human Services)
- 64% of 18-year-olds leaving Foster Care have NOT com- pleted High School (Child Welfare League of America)
- Only 2 % of former Foster Care Youths will graduate from College (Casey Family Programs)

### **EARN**

Compared to Local & National Statistics, our *"Foster Youth Program" Participants:* 

- 0% are incarcerated
- 99% have a **High School Degree** or GED
- 84% are enrolled in College and on schedule to Graduate

## **Meet Ashley Williams**

After four years in the Foster Care System, Ashley Williams, age 22, struggled transitioning into adulthood. Maintaining stable housing, completing her High School education and securing employment seemed like insurmountable goals. Last October she came to THE HOPE CENTER AT PULLEN full of worries about her past and difficulties in stabilizing her present.

Four months in the new "Foster Youth Program" at THE HOPE CENTER AT PULLEN provided her with the tools and support to find housing, secure a job and work toward earning her GED. "They made me believe in myself again. I can call

- 3 in 10 of our Nation's Homeless Adults have a history in the *Foster Care System* (National Alliance to End Homelessness, 2011)
- 50% of the Nation's 500,000 Foster Kids will NOT graduate from High School (Child Welfare League of America)
- 43% of Former Foster Youth in Wake County are unable to maintain a Job for 6 months or longer (Wake County Human Services)

- Maintained a Home for over 1.5 years

- Maintained a Job for over 1.5 years.

## **Meet Sharon Hipps**



Sharon is a former U.S. Marine and single mother of three grown children. She opened her own business in 2009 and in 2010 her body shut down under the stress of a failing business. Homelessness and depression often go together. She subsequently lost everything.

In 2011, Sharon became involved with the THE HOPE CENTER AT PULLEN and mentor Anne Kann. "It is so important to have someone to listen to...they listen to me," says Sharon. Utilizing the "Mental Health Services", "Mentoring" and "Job Development Services", Sharon has now maintained a home, a job, a company

car, and a strong support network at THE HOPE CENTER AT PULLEN.


