


# POWERING the Future of Foster Teens



The Hope Center at Pullen plugs foster teens and former foster youth into networks of support that power their growth and success.



Most teenagers can stay plugged into the resources they need to thrive as they transition to adulthood, such as housing and financial security. They are powered through their relationships with their families.

But many young people leaving foster care are suddenly unplugged from all networks of support.

The Hope Center at Pullen ensures all our young people leaving foster care can stay plugged in to the resources and supports they need to achieve a safe and stable adulthood.



# **TEEN PROGRAMS**

In 2020-21 our Teen Programs connected 62% of the foster teens in Wake County to supportive relationships and opportunities for growth through internships, tutoring, mentoring, and life skills groups. Here are some examples:

- Our 22 foster teens devoted more than 1,400 hours to their internships, learning workplace skills and earning over \$14,000 collectively.
- 100% of interns report being better prepared to enter the workforce.
- Tutors volunteered for more than 300 hours to ensure that 100% of tutored youth improved in the subjects in which they were tutored.




Our Transition Program is wired to help former foster teens achieve and maintain safe, stable housing, grounding our youth so we can then spark progress towards their self-sufficiency goals.

For the first time in their lives our clients are moving to stable, independent housing, often by utilizing our voucher programs. The voucher programs ensure clients pay the recommended 30% of their income towards their rent. And it works! At the end of the 2-year-voucher 90% of our client transitioned seamlessly into safe, stable permanent housing. Better yet, 50% of those clients didn't even have to move. They began to pay rent for their apartment completely on their own.

Stable housing is the boost former foster teens need to jump-start their futures. Our clients are pursuing post-secondary education at a rate more than double the national average.

### 2020 FINANCIAL INFORMATION



In 2020-21, as the pandemic continued, we spent 90% more than the previous year on rent assistance, hotels for temporary housing, and utility bills for our clients. We'd make this additional investment again in a heartbeat because it meant that 94% of our clients maintained safe and stable housing throughout the first two waves of the pandemic.

# MISSION:


The Hope Center at Pullen empowers emerging adults who are transitioning out of foster care in Wake County with the support and connections needed for a safe and stable adulthood.



# HOUSING

Nationally 43% of former foster care youth report experiencing homelessness by age 21, often multiple times.

93% of HCP clients who received housing assistance were successfully maintaining their housing at the end of the program year.



# **EDUCATION**

Nationally 56% of former foster youth report having a high school diploma or GED by age 19.

92% of HCP clients have their HS Diploma or GED.
