Emergency Housing Quads

We now own our own housing! Thanks to a leadership gift from the Gipson Family Foundation and capital campaign efforts, we raised funds to purchase two 4-bedroom, 4-bathroom condos to serve as temporary emergency housing for young adults transitioning out of foster care and awaiting permanent housing.




Hope Village at Method

In Fall 2025 we opened Hope Village at Method, a housing partnership with CASA North Carolina. This apartment complex will be home to eight of our Transition Program clients and one resident advisor. A project years in the making, Hope Village is the first community dedicated to permanently housing our young adults.



SUPPORTIVE SERVICES IMPACT SNAPSHOT

HOUSING



Nationally, **43%** of former foster youth report experiencing homelessness by age 21, often multiple times.

At HCP, **89%** of the young adults who came to us in need of housing secured stable housing by the end of the year.

EDUCATION



Nationally, only **56%** of former foster youth report having a high school diploma or GED by age 19.

At HCP, **96%** of our clients have or are pursuing their high school diploma or GED.

EMPLOYMENT



Nationally, only **50%** of former foster youth will be employed at age 24.

At HCP, **92%** of our clients were employed at the end of the year.



Mission: The Hope Center at Pullen empowers emerging adults who are transitioning out of foster care in Wake County with the support and connections needed for a safe and stable adulthood.

TEEN PROGRAMS

Our Teen Programs connect Wake County foster teens to supportive services and growth opportunities through internships, tutoring, mentoring, and life skills groups.



Internship Host and Teen Intern



19 foster youth completed our Summer Internship program, working over 2,000 hours and collectively earning almost \$34,000! HCP pays each intern a \$11-13 per hour stipend, funded by donations.



100% of interns felt motivated by their experience to continue their education.



85% of interns reported learning new computer skills and 92% reported gaining better communication skills.



100% of interns received exemplary performance reviews from their supervisors, with 2 receiving long-term job offers!



Our teens are keeping up! 100% of tutored foster youth passed or graduated at the end of the school year - Wake County's 2024-25 graduation rate is 90.6%.

Volunteers dedicated more than 2,000 hours to help our teens succeed!

TRANSITION PROGRAM

Our Transition Program is designed to guide former foster youth to stability and independence through addressing housing, education, employment, and mental health.



Our housing efforts work! Over the past four years, at the completion of their 2-year voucher, 93% of our clients transitioned into permanent housing and began to pay rent on their own.



100% of our clients on track to finish a post-secondary program received their certificate or degree.



73% of our young adults are furthering their education.

This year we surpassed \$70,000 in Fast Track Scholarships awarded to our clients!



61% of HCP clients engaged with a mental health professional.

Our clients have earned more than \$34,000 from our Mental Health Engagement Stipend over the last five years!



92% of our clients advanced in the workplace.
